

Thomas F. Whyne, Jr., MD, PhD, has been Professor of Medicine in the Division of Cardiovascular Medicine at the University of Kentucky since April 1998. Prior to then, he spent 21 years in the private practice of cardiology. He graduated from the University of Pennsylvania School of Medicine in 1963. Residency in Internal Medicine was at the New York Hospital-Cornell Medical Center. Cardiovascular training was at the Cardiovascular Research Institute, University of California-San Francisco and this included the award of a Ph.D. degree in Biochemistry in 1970. He is board certified in both Cardiovascular Disease and Internal Medicine. His patient practice is limited to cardiovascular medicine with major interests in the aggressive treatment of coronary atherosclerosis, blood lipid disorders and in the reduction of cardiovascular risk factors. Research interests include lipoprotein metabolism and innovative cardiovascular medical therapies. He has published over 90 manuscripts, book chapters and abstracts and has made over 45 international presentations in the Spanish language in Spanish speaking countries. Fellowship has been awarded in several professional organizations including the American College of Cardiology, the American College of Physicians, the American Heart Association, the Philadelphia College of Physicians and the International College of Angiology. He is listed in Who's Who in America, Who's Who in the World and Guide to America's Top Physicians. He has been active on various professional and lay boards and committees.
