



Dear Prospective Graduate Student;

Thank you for your interest in the University of Kentucky Communication Disorders Program. You are very important to us and we look forward to receiving your application and additional materials. The deadline for admission to the Graduate Program is February 1. *If you already have an undergraduate degree in speech-language pathology* you will begin your graduate studies in the 8-week summer session (please do not apply for the "4-week summer session". When filling out your application, please check "Summer" (Summer is listed as "8 week session") and indicate the same on the Graduate School application. *If you do not have an undergraduate degree in speech-language pathology*, you will begin your graduate studies in the Fall. When filling out your application, please check "Fall" and indicate the same on the Graduate School application. Keep in mind that there is a dual application process, one application to the Division of Communication Disorders and one to the UK Graduate School. The Graduate School application may be accessed on line at <http://www.rgs.uky.edu/gs/>

You should know that our curriculum requires two full calendar years to complete and typically begins with the summer term. *If you do not have an undergraduate degree in communication disorders*, your program will take three full calendar years to complete. Your three (3) reference forms should be given to people who can attest to your professional performance and provide an estimate of your ability to complete graduate study. (If you are sending these references through the mail to someone, please provide them with a self-addressed, stamped envelope). Please return your application, references, and official transcripts to: Office of Student Affairs, University of Kentucky, 900 S. In addition to your application, transcripts, and reference forms, we need two additional pieces of information from you. We need a current resume' and a one-page essay detailing your reasons for selecting speech-language pathology as your chosen field.

Information about financial assistance can be obtained through the University of Kentucky Office of Student Financial Aid.
