About the Course:

The management of temporomandibular disorders is a complex problem in dentistry. This complexity arises from the many different disorders that can be present as orofacial pain in the masticatory structures. In order to effectively manage TM disorders the clinician must first be able to differentiate these disorders from other orofacial pain conditions. Once a proper diagnosis is established the clinician can then select the appropriate therapy that will best resolve the disorder. Dr. Okeson has developed a sound and straightforward approach to understanding and treating many masticatory pain problems. Treatment based on sound scientific principles will be presented. Emphasis will be placed on diagnosis so that correct therapy will be selected for each patient. Appropriate use and fabrication of occlusal appliances will be discussed. Indications for dental therapy in the overall management of TM disorders and the role of the dental specialists will be presented in detail. This course will benefit all practitioners.

- To identify those pain disorders that will likely respond to your therapy from those that will not.
- The relationship between occlusion, bruxism and temporomandibular disorders.
- The most favorable condylar position for restorative dentistry and TMD.
- To differentiate those cases that require orthodontic or restorative procedures from those that do not.
- When it is appropriate to consider surgical therapy for a patient.
- Which headaches are best managed in the dental office and how to successfully treat them.
- The appropriate use of occlusal appliance therapy.

Dr. Okeson is Professor, Chairman of the Department of Oral Health Science at the University of Kentucky and Director of the College's Orofacial Pain Center, which he established in 1977. He has authored three textbooks on TM disorders and orofacial pain that are presently used in most US dental schools and have been translated into eleven different languages. He has also published more than 200 articles and chapters. Dr. Okeson is a very sought after lecturer on the subject of TMD and orofacial pain and has presented more than 700 invited lectures on the subject of TMD and orofacial pain in 49 different states and in 45 different countries. He has received the campus wide University of Kentucky "Great Teacher Award" and is the recipient of the first ever "Distinguished Alumni Award" from the College of Dentistry. Dr. Okeson has also received "The International Dentist of the Year Award" from the Academy of Dentistry International. This is the highest award recognized by this Academy and was given to him in recognition of his worldwide efforts in providing education in the area of temporomandibular disorders and orofacial pain.
