Program

This introductory course will present the process of dental identification of unknown human remains when other means of identification fail. Single, multiple and mass disaster dental identifications will be presented using real cases.

By the end of this course participants will learn:

- The types of remains requiring dental identification.
- Processing the remains to create a postmortem dental chart.
- Collection of the antemortem dental record and the creation of the antemortem dental chart.
- The identification process.
- Introduction of NCIC, NAMUS and VICTIMS national databases for missing and unidentified persons.
- Mass disaster dental identification, problems and solutions.
- Presentations on the identification of the victims of major disasters, including Hurricane Katrina and the World Trade Center.

He has lectured throughout the United States and abroad on forensic dentistry. He has published extensively in the field of forensic dentistry. He also enjoys spending time researching in the area of bite mark evidence collection and analysis, both the traditional and high tech approaches.
