**What You Will Learn**

This course will present a sound, straight-forward approach to treating many masticatory pain problems. Emphasis will be placed on proper diagnosis so that correct therapy can be selected for each patient. Principles used to locate the site and source of pain will be presented. The role of occlusion in TMD will be discussed in detail. Specific information will be provided for the management of the two most common types of temporomandibular disorders; masticatory muscle pain and intracapsular TMJ pain.

**Jeffrey P. Okeson, DMD**, is professor and chairman of the Department of Oral Health Science at the University of Kentucky College of Dentistry and director of the College's Orofacial Pain Center, which he established in 1977. Dr. Okeson has authored three textbooks on TM disorders and orofacial pain that are presently used in most US dental schools and have been translated into 11 different languages. He also has published more than 200 articles

and chapters. He has presented more than 650 invited lectures on the subject of TMD and orofacial pain in 48 different states and in 42 foreign countries.
