What You Will Learn

How well prepared are you and your office staff for medical emergencies? This three-hour course is designed to satisfy the Kentucky State Dental Practice Act requirement regarding “the identification and prevention of potential medical emergencies”, as required for dental hygienists to work under general supervision. Commonly encountered medical emergencies are addressed. Emphasis is placed on the immediate, non-pharmacological aspects of care.
