

Questions/Answers for Potential Orthodontic Patients

Q. How do I become a patient of the orthodontic clinic?

A. An orthodontic screening appointment is scheduled, with an orthodontic faculty, to determine the type of orthodontic treatment that you need. At that time, the faculty member will determine the type of treatment needed, and estimate of time in treatment and an estimate of the cost. If the case can be referred to the resident orthodontic clinic the Doctor will discuss this option. Call the office at: 859-323-5655 to schedule an appointment.

Q. How much does the screening cost?

A. The screening appointment is no charge.

Q. What is the difference between the faculty clinic and the resident clinic?

A. Each orthodontic faculty, all having orthodontic certificates, has a private practice at the college. They see their private patients 1-2 days a week. Patients can be referred to the resident clinic under the supervision of a faculty. The patient must then be seen on the days that the assigned faculty is present.

Q. Do you offer invisalign?

A. Yes. If you are interested in this type of treatment, the Doctor will evaluate you during the screening to see if you are a candidate.

Q. How much will treatment cost?

A. This is discussed at the screening appointment. The fee is determined according to the treatment

Q. Do you accept insurance?

A. Yes, we accept most dental insurance. Your coverage is subject to the limitations and qualifications of your insurance provider.

Q. Do you accept the Medical Card?

A. Yes, but subject to case and availability.

Q. Where is your office located?

A. The resident clinic is on the fourth floor of the Dental School. The faculty clinic is on the third floor of the Dental School.
