

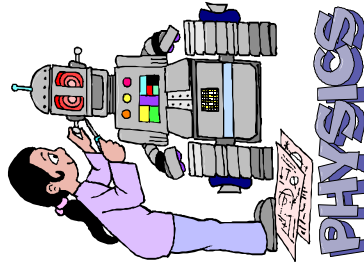
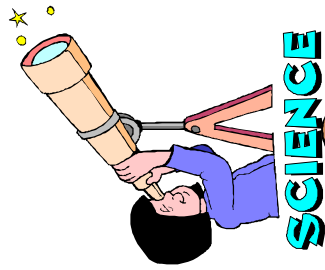

What is

Girls in Science?

- A program designed to introduce middle-school girls from southeastern Kentucky to careers in scientific and research fields

Involves:

- A one-week camp at the University of Kentucky for two consecutive summers
- Five Saturday academies throughout the school year for two years at participants' local community colleges
- Mentoring relationships with a University of Kentucky scientific mentor and a local community mentor
- Girls in Science clubs in local schools

Who can participate?

Participants enter the "Girls in Science" program the summer prior to 7th grade and remain in the program through the end of 8th grade.
