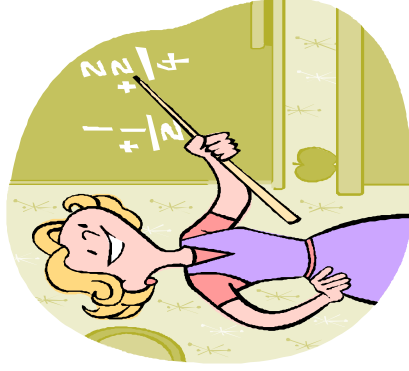

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What is Girls in Science?

For Girls:

- A program designed to introduce middle school girls from southeastern Kentucky to careers in scientific and research fields.

For Teachers:

- A two-day series of workshops at the University of Kentucky with all expenses paid, plus a stipend.
- Establishing Girls in Science clubs in local middle schools

Who can participate?

- The Girls in Science Program involves teachers who teach at least 2 math, technology, computer, or science courses at the middle school level.
- Teachers with at least one year of experience are preferred.

Program Details

- Teachers attend a two-day seminar at the University of Kentucky on gender equity, scientific subjects, and strategies to increase female participation in the sciences.
- Teachers participate in the program for two consecutive years.
- Teachers will receive a \$300 stipend and continuing education credits.
- Teachers will receive \$500 to create Girls in Science clubs in their local schools.
