Project 2030 is a joint project between the State of MN and the MN board on Aging. Its purpose is to identify the impacts of the aging of Minnesota's population and help prepare the State's response to the baby boom generation that begins turning 85 in 2030.

The Project has 4 broad themes:

- Helping baby boomers save and prepare for their retirement and old age.
- Emphasizing personal responsibility for long term care planning and health promotion and maintenance.
- Increasing "age-sensitive" physical, service and social infrastructures at the community level, including wise land use and community design, life cycle housing, responsive service delivery systems and strong social ties within communities.
- Continuing economic vitality of communities and the State through creative use of our aging population, both in the work force and non-paid roles.
