The Kentucky AIDS Education and Training Center (KY AETC), located at the University of Kentucky, provides free HIV/AIDS training and consultation services to Kentucky healthcare providers. The KY AETC program offers valuable information to provide up-to-date optimal medical care including a warmline which can be accessed by any healthcare provider.

At KY AETC, skilled specialists including physicians, pharmacists, dentists, nurses and physician assistants will share their years of experience in practice and research in HIV/AIDS care. The rural nature of Kentucky makes accessing proper medical care a challenge for many HIV/AIDS patients. Free training for healthcare providers is available at the University of Kentucky, at your own facility, or via teleconferencing.

valuable tool for those new to HIV/AIDS care or for those who desire further, up-to-date training. In a clinical preceptorship, participants learn by shadowing experienced medical/dental/pharmaceutical specialists as they care for HIV/AIDS patients. Preceptorships are custom-designed for each attendee to meet their specific needs. Visits can range from a day to a couple of weeks depending on the individual needs and objectives of the provider.

Educational Credit

Medicine:

- ◆ Participation in a multidisciplinary team, including primary care, mental health, & case management

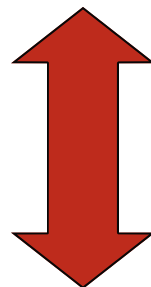

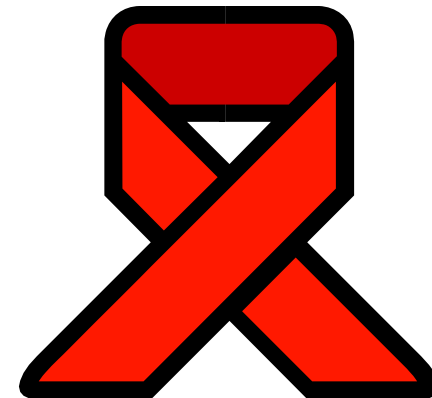

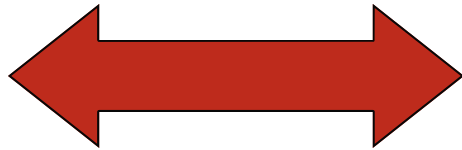

Eligibility Requirements for Successful Completion of a HIV/AIDS Clinical Preceptorship

- ◆ Candidate should register a month in advance of requested date of preceptorship.
- ◆ Candidate must provide medical documentation of a TB screening within the past six months. Evidence must be brought on day of preceptorship.
- ◆ Candidate must complete pre-preceptorship paperwork in full.
- ◆ Candidate must be present throughout entire clinical experience on designated date.
- ◆ Candidate must complete post-preceptorship paperwork in full.
- ◆ Candidate must complete any other necessary paperwork required by host site.

Rotation Options

- ◆ Adult outpatient HIV/AIDS care
- ◆ HIV dental clinic
- ◆ HIV outpatient pharmacology
- ◆ Mental health/substance abuse management
- ◆ Medical Case Management
- ◆ Technical Assistance
- ◆ Other HIV-specific topics depending on provider's needs

Learning Objectives for Providers

- ◆ Communicate with HIV/AIDS patients in an effective, empathetic, and compassionate manner including the provision of medical and drug histories, prevention strategies, and adherence and medication counseling.
- ◆ Demonstrate self-directed learning in the area of HIV and AIDS by identifying learning points and following up with outside readings.
- ◆ Interact with various health care practitioners in order to provide care for those infected with HIV.
- ◆ Describe pharmacologic and non-pharmacologic issues as they relate to the care of persons infected with HIV.
