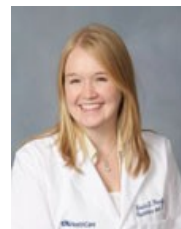
seen this grow as we have already expanded the number of pages from the first issue. Watch your email for the next issue which will be in December.
