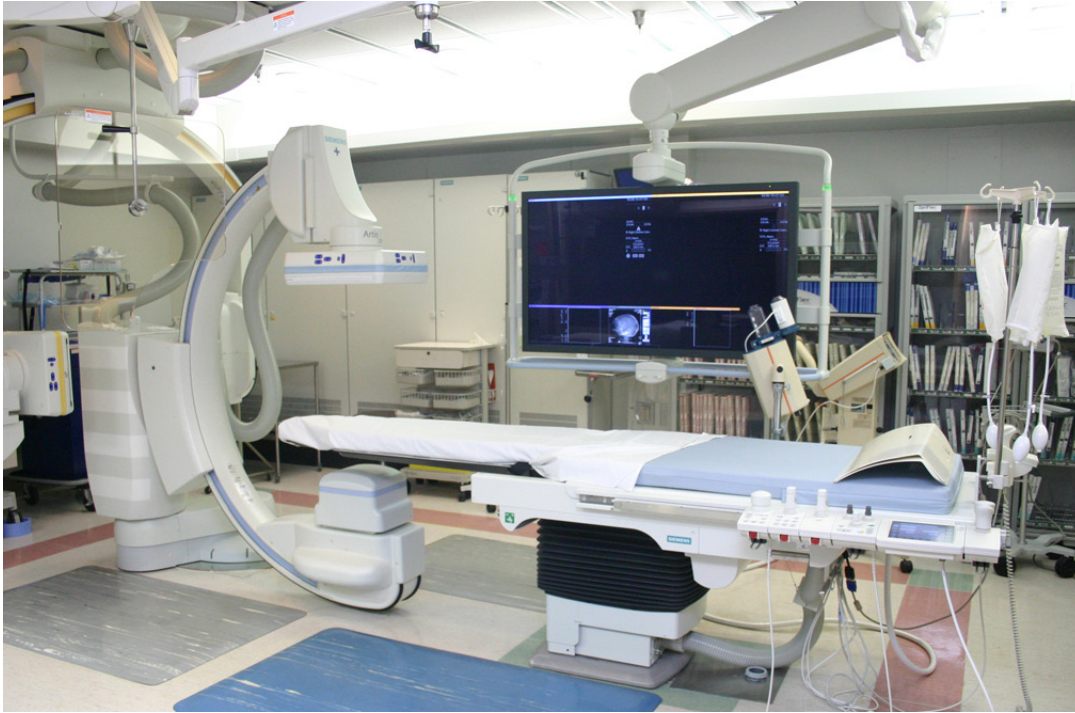

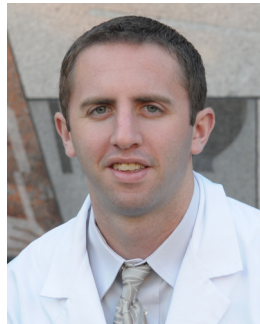


### Artis zee Biplane system
