

Dr. Rathan Subramaniam

Dr Subramaniam is an Assistant Professor of Radiology and Nuclear Medicine at the Boston University School of Medicine, Boston, MA, USA. He attended University of Melbourne medical school, Melbourne, Australia and did radiology residency in New Zealand. He completed a Masters at the University of New South Wales, Sydney, Australia and a PhD at the University of Auckland, Auckland, New Zealand.

He was an American College of Radiology Imaging Network (ACRIN) fellow and spent time at the National Cancer Institute / National Institute of Health, USA. He did a Nuclear Medicine fellowship and then a Neuroradiology fellowship at the Mayo Clinic, Rochester. He was an Assistant Professor of Radiology at the Mayo Clinic from 2006 to 2008.

His current research interest is oncologic imaging with PET tracers with FDG, FLT and ^{64}Cu ATSM. He is the institutional PI for ACRIN studies and a member of the Department of Radiology Research committee and Education Committee at Boston University. Nationally, he sits in the ACRIN Head and Neck and Neuroradiology committee, Experimental Imaging committee and FDG PET Quantitative Imaging Biomarker Alliance (QIBA) of RSNA. He is a current RSNA research scholar and a GERRAF fellow.

He was awarded over 30 scholarships and awards including a New Zealand Fulbright travel award to the United States and a Mayo Brothers Distinguished Fellowship award. He has delivered over 60 national and international invited lectures and presentations. He has over 40 peer reviewed publications.
