

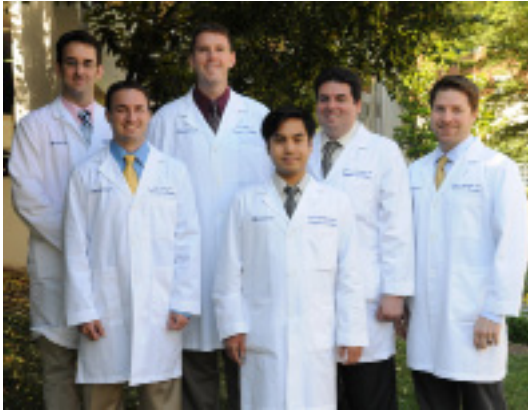

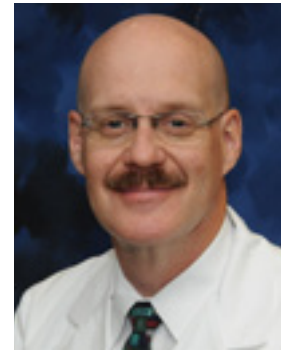

Problem-Solving to Improve Our Patients' Care

Technical staff and radiologists cooperate to improve kidney studies

X-ray contrast studies of the kidneys (intravenous pyelograms or IVP's) have nearly been replaced by CT, ultrasound, and MRI. But for some patients, an IVP is still the right test to provide the answers that their doctor needs. Since some of the more antiquated equipment used for IVP's is no longer available, medical and technical staff members combined their expertise to provide an effective alternative.

Karsten Colwell (Gill Imaging Center technical manager) and Emily Woods (Chandler CT technical manager), working with Drs. Stevens and DiSantis, developed protocols to combine parts of the IVP with kidney CT views. The result: a higher quality study that limits both cost and radiation dose. "This is the perfect 'feel good' success story that you love to hear," said Dr. DiSantis. "It's a great example of UK radiology folks combining their skills to do things better for our patients and for our referring physicians."

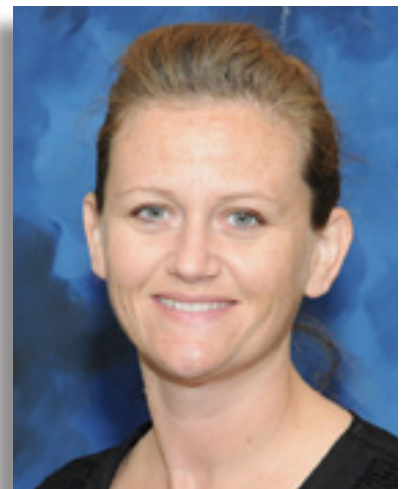
